Brief Introduction

It was in the year 1991 when few likeminded young and qualified people came together to serve the society with purest commitment. All these people had some prior exposures in social and development sector but they felt that there is an urgent need to form an organization which is socially responsible at its core and at the same time is professionally managed. Hence year 1992 saw the genesis of Lok Prerna as a registered body. Lok Prerna is registered as a non-profit organization in 1992 under Societies Registration Act and rewarded FCRA first time in 1994 and after the formation of Jharkhand as a separate state FCRA status was renewed in 2002 to receive foreign contribution.

The organization has been working with the **vision** of equity with equality, based on values of peace, co-existence and self-reliance, devoid of inequalities and discriminations based on caste, creed, religion and sex; where individuals including the most vulnerable population have opportunities of life with dignity. It has been working for the empowerment of the lowest sections of the society (with special focus on women and children) and introduces participatory action research for their access to services and ability to influence policies. It has supported activities like natural resource management, land and agriculture promotion, income generation activities, vocational training, water and sanitation activities, education and strengthening people's organization.

The child and women rights are the cross cutting issues of the organization. Over the years, consistent and prudent efforts of the organization has enabled it to have a deep insight into the problem of the disadvantaged and deprived section of the community ensuring closer link with people and their benefactors including the government. Its concerted and integrated efforts has brought following commendable outcomes in its operational areas bringing eye catching changes in the attitude and action.

Objectives:

To train women & men from village to act as volunteers and catalyst for the development of their villages.

To train village youth who may become builders of their villages and creator of their own culture and history.

To cooperate with the development activities of the Government and other agencies so that all the efforts may, without any duplication and complication, serve the cause of the target people.

To promote initiatives such as agriculture development, animal husbandry and village industries so as to develop economic order that may meet the credit and other needs of the people

To motivate and promote people to protect and nurture their environment, which could contribute the shares in building up a world, which is maintained as if giving home for all the people of today and tomorrow.

To initiate community Health Education among the people so that they could be aware of the manifold health hazards and their own potentialities to take appropriate preventive, promotable and curative health activities and evolve such a Health Care System which is effective, affordable, easily available and acceptable.

To carry out research and documentation as well as dissemination of relevant information for improving and sustaining the development process as networking service.

Thematic Interventions during 2018-19 and their outcomes

Health

The primary requirement for performing any task is physical g. interestingly the illness and poverty are seen as an exogenous factors and no relation between the two is sought. To one hand the poor don't have access to improved health facilities and to another they are bound to spend the hard earned money for medical treatments. For those who don't have money to pay become victims of money lenders and give away their lands, cattle, jewellery etc. in their possession.





The physical unfitness results into children absenteeism at schools, loss of wages for daily wage earners the infected child borne out of sick mother and draining of assets. The whole process can be seen as a vicious cycle and hence it becomes impractical for the poor to opt for improved health practices. The organization has taken numerous steps for promotion of improved health status and addressed the underlying problems during the reporting period.

Promotion of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Practices

The fact can't be ignored that the accessibility to improved water, sanitation and hygiene practices along with behaviour change is a sustainable answer to address health hazards problems. Availability of infrastructure facilities and changed mind set is the first step for promoting improved health practices. It is imperative to ensure proper health facilities to rural folk prior to ensuring the reach of any developmental schemes to them. If the girl's education is to be promoted in the rural areas sanitary facilities must be available at schools. Similarly if the instances of diarrhoea, typhoid and malaria are to be tackled, safe water and sanitary





latrines must be made accessible and for improved hygiene practices

the adolescent girls must be educated about personal hygiene and sanitation. Lok Prerna has been playing a catalytic role in the promotion of improved health status for the rural folk. Since 2004 the organization has been working on intensively in five districts viz. Deoghar, Dumka, Jamatara, Pakur



and Giridih for ensuring water, sanitation and hygiene facilities. Community mobilization through awareness campaigns, Development and dissemination of IEC materials, Nukkar Natak etc. set the platform for changing the people's perceptions towards traditional approach of WASH Issues. During the reporting period the organization adhered to its basic philosophy of supporting the poorest of the poor and excluded communities like people with disabilities, widows and tribal population.



Promotion of Health Camps

There is no doubt that the govt. of India has excellent programs and schemes focused for poor but at the same time the bottlenecks and challenges in their implementations are also intriguing. One of such

Rural Health Mission (NRHM) which was launched in the year 2005 with an objective of reducing Maternal



Mortality Rate (MMR), Infant Mortality Rate (IMR), prevention of communicable and non-communicable diseases, including locally endemic diseases, population stabilization, gender and demographic balance. But the program has been unable to achieve its complete objectives so far. The underlying reason behind the limited acceptability of the program is unawareness among the rural population. The impact of project which was done in the previous year is well reflected as the sahiya and health workers are continuously working for promotion of health issues.

Watershed Development Program for Sustainable Agriculture Development:

Introduction- RIDF-NABARD project is a watershed development project supported by Govt. of Jharkhand and implemented by LOK PRERNA. The project is started on FY-2016-17 in 52 villages of 2 Blocks Fatehpur & Nala of Jamtara District. Here is the detail mention below-

<u>A Watershed-</u> Watershed is a geo hydrological unit surrounded by a ridgeline in which all the rain water comes through a common Outlet/River.

Importance of Soil and Water-

- 1. Soil & Water are the most valuable Natural Resources exist on the Earth Surface for Sustainable Agricultural Development.
- 2. It requires 1000 Years to develop 25 mm/ 1 inch Surface Soil from Parent Materials through Natural Processes.
- 3. One Rainy Season is sufficient enough to erode valuable top soils and washed out rain water.
- 4. Conservation of Soil & Water plays vital role for successful implementation of Watershed Management Programme in Jharkhand state.

Why Watershed Needed-

1. National level-

- a. Only 12% of rainwater is being used in country the rest flows into sea.
- b. Only 10% of surface water and 90% of groundwater are being used for drinking purposes.
- c. The World Bank estimates that by the year 2025, 3.25 billion people in 52 countries will live in conditions of water shortage.
- d. India Share globally Hume resource 16%, livestock 15% and the Water resource is 4%.

2. In Jharkhand-

- a. Due to very undulation in land to much soil erosion will occur.
- b. in Jharkhand there is good rain fall. (Ls 1000ml-1200ml/Year) but there is shortage of Water.
- c. Excess of wasteland and fallow land.
- d. Decrease in Agriculture productivity. And also decrease in Livestock productivity e. Maximum Nos. of trebles and small farmers. f. Lake of Knowledge.


